


Patterns for kikkô. (Sizes indicated)

Simple way to make kikkô:

- 1. Cut your *kikkô* material either steel or plastic — into strips .6" wide.
- 2. Copy and print the bit on the left, and attach it with a spray adhesive to the strip.
- 3. Use a drill press (the easiest method owing to the ability to make a jig for standardized hole placement) or drill or punch the holes.
- 4. Using tin snips or a hobby knife, cut away the individual plates. If using metal, make sure the edges are flat and smooth.
- 5. If using metal, place each plate in an indented form and smack with a ball-pien hammer to make the concavity. If using plastic, don't bother. You're done.
